CiscoWorks 3.0 Read Me First

This document contains important information that you should read *before* you install your CiscoWorks or CiscoView CD-ROM discs.

The CiscoWorks package contains the following 2 CD-ROMS:

A CiscoWorks CD-ROM

This CD-ROM contains CiscoWorks 3.0(1) for SunOS and CiscoWorks 3.0 (3) for Solaris.

A CiscoView CD-ROM

This CD-ROM contains CiscoView 3.0(3) for SunOS.

To install CiscoWorks for SunOS properly:

Step 1 First, install CiscoWorks 3.0(1) from a CD-ROM with one of the following part numbers:

CiscoWorks CD-ROM/SNM: 80-0304-03

or CiscoWorks CD-ROM/HP: 80-0305-03

Step 2 Then, install CiscoView 3.0(3) from the CD-ROM with the following part number:

CiscoView 3.0(3) CD-ROM: 85-0148-03.

Note Installing the above 2 CD-ROM discs in the wrong order will cause the install to fail.

All components of CiscoWorks 3.0(3) for Solaris are contained on the CiscoWorks CD-ROM. The CiscoView CD-ROM disc is not necessary for installing CiscoWorks on Solaris.

Cisco Information Online
