About This Guide

This guide describes how to install and use TrueView applications. For detailed information about a TrueView application, refer to the user guide supplied with the management application.

Audience

This guide is for network administrators. It assumes you are familiar with Token Ring local-area networks (LANs) and Microsoft Windows.

Terminology

This guide contains the following terms with the following specific meanings:

Bridge Any bridge on the network.

Mouse The physical device (not the mouse pointer).

Pointer The representation of the mouse on the screen.

Option button A button on the screen, which is typically selected (on) or clear (off), that

you click on to indicate an option. If an option button has a black center, that indicates it is selected (on). If an option button has a white center, that indicates it is not selected. You can only select one option button in a

group of option buttons.

Check box A box on the screen, which is typically selected (on) or clear (off), that

you click on to indicate an option. An 'X' in a check box indicates it is selected (on). You can select a check box without affecting other check

boxes.

Conventions

This guide has the following conventions:

Ctrl + A Hold down the Ctrl key and press the A key. That is, press the Ctrl key

and the A key at the same time. Release both keys.

[] The enclosed items are optional.

<> The enclosed can have a variety of values.

italic type Document titles.

boldface type User input and menu selections.

UPPERCASE Filenames, directory names, and disk drive names.

You need a networked personal computer with the following hardware and software specifications:

- 80486 series IBM PC or compatible computer running at 25MHz (80486 at 50MHz recommended).
- 8 Mbytes RAM (16Mbytes recommended).
- 510 Kbytes of free conventional memory before running Microsoft Windows.
- 13 Mbytes of free disk space for all TrueView management applications.
- VGA graphics card and monitor (SVGA recommended).
- Mouse supported by Microsoft Windows version 3.1.
- Blank disks on which to make a copy of the distribution disks.
- MS-DOS version 5.0 (or later).
- Microsoft Windows version 3.1 (or later) running in Enhanced mode.
